**Rochelle Park Plans Budget** 

The Rochelle Park Township Committee met on Wednesday, February 6, 2013 with representatives from all departments to discuss the upcoming budget and decide how to best address the township's needs going forward.

Chief Financial Officer Roy Riggitano gave his 2013 Budget Outlook and noted that a true township assessment was not available due to Superstorm Sandy. Revenues were right on target, with two items standing out. The Building Department had a few big projects and the Municipal Court had a good fiscal fourth quarter (through incurred fines and charged penalties). Riggitano added that the cash surplus of \$3 million had not yet been confirmed. Approximately \$150,000 in surplus was being used each year with plans to continue. The capital improvement fund held \$50,000, which meant that the town could bond up to \$1 million, if needed. Riggitano closed by saying that the township finances had been handled responsibly by both the Township Committee and the individual departments; so the township is off to a good start.

Police Chief Robert Flannelly reported that the department had stayed within the confines of the \$85,000 budget last year with a spending total of \$72,000. Flannelly added that two police vehicles were due to retire and needed to be replaced. The department practices a rotating lease and requested approval to acquire two new trucks. Police



to reach their ultimate goal, a novel entitled, "40 Years In

Rodriguez and Vigorito researched, collected stories from family members, attended conferences, took writing classes, all to put together the perfect historical novel based on Rodriguez's idea. Over the years, the women

had heard many a tale from their elders. Some of the stories were fascinating and sometimes even unbelievable. The task of piecing together the puzzle of tales was daunting, but one that the budding authors took on with vigor. At times, Rodriguez noted, "We were forced to conjure up our own conclusions from pieces of stories and then add a dose of sensationalism to make it more interest-

ing." As their work evolved, the fictional story of a family and their trials and triumphs over several decades started

The historical novel begins in Italy in the year 1900 where the main character, Victoria, and her four children escape from Italy and arrive on the streets of New York, specifically Hell's Kitchen. Years later, on his 90th birthday, Victoria's eldest son, Vincenzo Montanaro (based on Rodriguez's own father) shares the "gut-wrenching account of the family's lives" with his daughter. The cover of the soon-to-be-released novel depicts an older gentleman sitting on a park bench with a girl and the Statue of Liberty is in the foreground on what appears to be a grey, cold day in New York.

After seven years of hard work, writing and re-writing, and then another year in production, "40 Years In A Day" will be released on February 19. Rodriguez said she learned that there is a definite formula on how to write a book and the work that comes with seeing it through to the end. After completing the draft, going through multiple revisions, then pitching their story to agents, an editor really liked the idea and worked with the women. After a few more minor tweaks, Tate Publishing "went with it", said Rodriguez. Pre-release copies of the book are currently available through Tate Publishing, Nikki's Hallmark in Maywood, and Bookends in Ridgewood. You can preorder the novel on Amazon, Barnes and Noble or Powell's. A portion of the proceeds from the sale of the book will be donated to the Children's Aid Society of New York. Rodriguez stated that her father lived in Hell's Kitchen and the Children's Aid Society played an important part

Looking back now, as her book is about to be published, Rodriguez gently laughs as she recalls wanting

to give up at times during the long process. But the desire to write a book was stronger and the authors prevailed and are now currently working on a sequel which "will take six cousins into the next forty years", declared Rodriguez

Rodriguez's twin sons, Joel and David, although not living locally (Joel resides in New York and David in San Francisco) were

a constant source of support and believed in their mother's venture. Joel had this to say about his mom's upcoming book, "My mother dove deep into the history of her Italian family to unearth the stories, culture and sentiments that would become the foundation for the characters, the setting and dialog in "Forty Years in a Day." Joel continued, "Her connection to her family who immigrated to America gives the book an authenticity and charm that makes it feel like a classic historical novel."
